District Superintendent

As you all know, "the squeaky wheel" tends to grab our attention. But I have so enjoyed the times spent with spiritually healthy pastors and churches across the Midwest District (MWD). Which, by the way, is true of most pastors and churches. Of course, all of us need to continue to reflect the light of Jesus more brightly ("But the path of the righteous is like the light of dawn, that shines brighter and brighter until the full day" Prov. 4:18.). Nevertheless, I am thankful that the great majority of the MWD pastors and churches are on the "right path," seeking to know and serve Jesus better. Providing for and encouraging this close walk with Jesus is the major part of my role as District Superintendent.

I could not do the work required of me without our excellent Support Staff. Cindy Renteria (Executive Assistant) and LaRene Beebout (Financial/Ministry Assistant) continue to cover the, sometimes overwhelming, MWD office needs. The full-time pastors who also serve the District are: Phil Green, Director of Theology and Credentialing; Abdel Gonzalez, Hispanic Ministries Coordinator; and Lige Reed, District Student Ministries Director. In addition, we have a full time, self-supporting Missions Catalyst, Kerry Relihan. For the MWD to serve pastors and churches well, the work these men do is essential. Though the role is still developing, Pastor Mike Sechler has stepped forward to be the MWD Church Planting Representative.

This past year was unusual in that four churches have either closed their doors or moved out of the EFCA. Rosehill EFC (Newman Grove, NE) and RiverPoint Church (Newton, KS) have closed. Polk EFC (NE) has joined with another local church, becoming independent. Vox Dei Community Church (Belton, MO) has also chosen to become independent. Calvary Community Church (Nebraska City) has closed its Hispanic Church plant, Libre Evangelica Iglesia Fe Eficaz.

It is my prayer that more MWD churches will be given the vision, the desire and opportunity to move forward in the realm of church planting.

Grand Island EFC hosted TRANSFORM 2018, doing an excellent job in serving the MWD churches. The worship, fellowship, training and focus on God's word at the annual conference is always a yearly highlight and a joy to see and experience.

Due to the generous funding of a donor, the district provided reimbursements for any pastors/wives attending the Weekend to Remember conferences in 2018. Investing in the marriages of pastors/wives is an ongoing desire.

Another praise item was the November starting of a new pastoral cluster in the Omaha/Lincoln area, serving up to 12 churches. Clusters provide a wonderful opportunity for encouragement and "iron sharpening iron."

Looking forward with great anticipation for what God will do in the MWD in 2019!

Last Year

- In July of 2018 the Midwest District hosted Reach Student's Challenge conference in Kansas City. Over 4,000 students, 7th-12th grades, and youth workers showed up to learn about the Bold Moves of Jesus and started making Bold Moves of their own.
- Last spring the Student Ministry Lead Team sent a survey out to the churches throughout the district to try to gain a better understanding of demographics and needs of our youth ministries. Although the survey wasn't done by many churches, the churches who did respond helped us a lot. So, thank you.
- In October of last year seven Churches' in Central Nebraska partnered together for the "ELEVATE" Middle School Retreat. Around 150 middle school students spent time building relationships in their own groups and with peers from the other groups. That happened through time praying together, worshiping together, playing games together, eating together and learning from different pastors who taught from the book of James.
- Throughout this last year we have seen over 20 pastors connect in Network meetings across the District.
- In August of last year, National Director Shane Stacey stepped out of his role to go back into the local church ministry.

Right Now

- According to the latest information we have gathered, both locally and from the National office, there are currently 38 paid pastors/directors throughout the District that focus on the Next Generation. These 38 pastors/directors come from 29 different churches.
- At the time of writing this report the National Director position has not been filled. The search process is narrowing the field down to the final candidate.

Planning Ahead

- This semester, January - June, I will be rearranging and establishing new Network Meetings across the district in the hopes of connecting more Family & Next Gen pastor/directors with each other.
- Throughout 2019 the Student Ministry Lead Team (SMLT) will be working to clarify and establish the vision for the MWD Reach Students in a way that helps Reach Students and the Midwest District accomplish their visions.
- Some of the SMLT will be exploring ways for youth ministries with paid staff to serve and equip the youth ministries that are volunteer led or Senior Pastor led.

Prayer Requests

- Pray for the Student Ministry Lead Team to find time to gather together so we can work on the vision for the MWD Reach Students.
- Pray for youth ministries to have a heart for disciple-making. For it is out of youth ministries that the next generation of disciple-makers as volunteers, pastors, church planters, missionaries, business leaders, and politicians will come from.

Director of Theology and Credentialing

For the Kingdom of God is not just a lot of talk; it is living by God's power (1 Corinthians 4:20, NLT).

In a context where false teachers are making a lot of fancy speeches, The Apostle Paul reminds the Corinthian believers that living life under the rule of God is more than just being able to preach a good sermon. It is living out the truth of God's Word by depending on His power. To that end, in partnership with our Midwest District churches and the National Board of Ministerial Standing (BOMS), the District Board of Ministerial Standing (DBOMS) in each region, comes along side each credentialing candidate to ensure that they are not only speaking the truth, but living it out.

We do that in two ways. First, the DBOMS team in each credentialing interview focuses on what the candidate says about each of the ten (10) declarations in the current EFCA doctrinal statement, looking for them to back up what they say with Scripture. The team also examines how the candidate applies Scripture to various contemporary issues and to their own spiritual life. For licensing candidates, the DBOMS team looks for theological competency in a 20-page paper, along with a 1½ to 2-hour interview. For Christian Ministry Certificate candidates, the DBOMS team looks for theological proficiency in a 30-page paper, along with a 4 to 5-hour interview. And for Ordination candidates, the DBOMS team looks for theological mastery in a 40-page paper, along with a 5 to 6-hour interview.

Second, the chairman of each DBOMS team and I review the three Personal Spiritual and Character Qualifications (PSCQ) questionnaires that each candidate must submit as part of the credentialing process: one from the candidate, one from his (or her) spouse, and one from the church's leadership. These questionnaires are quite extensive and give us a good picture of the candidate's character before we examine their teaching in an extensive credentialing interview.

My job in that process is as follows: 1) Support the regional Boards of Ministerial Standing, through their chairmen, as they examine candidates for credentialing to make sure they are within the bounds of Free Church doctrine and practice; 2) Shepherd candidates through the credentialing process (praying for them, giving feedback on their credentialing theses, answering questions, providing words of encouragement, etc.) so they are ready to give a clear written and oral defense of "the faith once for all delivered to the saints" (Jude 3); 3) Work with district staff to effectively implement credentialing policies and procedures as required by district and national BOMS and perform other duties as required by the district superintendent.

In 2018, I worked with at least nine credentialing candidates, reviewing their papers, answering questions, and coaching them through the credentialing process. I participated in three licensing interviews and two ordination interviews, along with answering the inquiries of several people interested in credentialing in the EFCA. Additionally, I completed teaching an online Gateway class in October 2018, involving two (2) students, which met monthly, to help students study and prepare for the EFCA Ministry License, and began teaching another online Gateway class, involving five (5) students in November 2018.

I could not do my job without the help of many in the district, starting with Cindy Renteria, our executive assistant. She takes care of all the details of contacting candidates, sending them the required credentialing information, keeping a file for each candidate, sending their completed files to the national BOMS, sending schedules and information to each region's DBOMS members, and keeping me straight on all the details.

I also appreciate the work of each regional DBOMS team. They are on the front lines of this ministry, putting hours of work into reviewing each credentialing thesis, interviewing each candidate, and then following up as necessary after the interview. The chairmen are especially busy, communicating with their boards and candidates, recruiting additional personnel to serve on the board as needed, organizing the interviews, approving credentialing theses that need revision after the interview, and sometimes working with a subcommittee to re-examine the candidate if necessary. There is a tremendous amount of work involved, so I want to express my deepest gratitude to Rev. Donald Moore (Nebraska City, NE) who served as chairman of the east region DBOMS, Duane Russell (Lexington, NE), who served as chairman of the west region DBOMS, and Al Schirmacher (Muscotah, KS), who served as chairman of the south region DBOMS.

Hispanic Ministries Director

It is 2019 and God has been faithful. Last year, 2018 was a difficult year for me, a year of changes, challenges, and discouragements. It was a year where God showed his power, and it was his power in me that sustained me, not my own strength.

Hispanic Ministries

The Hispanic ministries in the district went through challenges, growth and trials. The church in Broken Bow NE and Camino de Vida in Lexington partnered up to start a new Hispanic outreach. Pastor David Santos was brought from Mexico to lead it. He will be working as a regional missionary, helping the district reach out to Hispanics. In September at Broken Bow EFC they had a beautiful bilingual commissioning service where we sang in English and Spanish and pastor David Santos preached.

On Dec 3rd El Faro (Lighthouse) Church in Wichita KS, purchased a small church building and with the help of a couple sister churches were able to rehabilitate it. One of the Hispanic churches closed, which has been a painful process. We are learning though all of it. November was a mini retreat for Hispanic pastors and families in Lexington, NE. It was a time of refueling, laughter, encouragement and planning.

Your Church's Involvement in Hispanic Ministries

I was invited by district churches to preach and share about the region's Hispanic ministries. I would love to come to your church and share about Hispanic ministries in the district. Could I cast a vision for your church to reach out to those God has brought into your area, who need to hear the gospel? I want to ask you to keep us in your prayers. We are praying, working and doing everything we can to have stable, self-supported and sending churches. Reality is, all the Hispanic churches are fragile. We are going in the right direction, but are still far from maturity, and we continue to need your help: Financially, with moral support, with teams to help us with programs like VBS and service projects, things we can't afford or don't have the man power to do.

Looking Ahead

Activities we are planning for 2019 and would love your prayers for are:

- 1- EFCA One National Conference: We are trying to bring Hispanic pastors from the district to the conference to meet with other 80 pastors from Hispanic churches in the EFCA. To be able to get away from their church, meet other pastors doing the same thing, and learn with one another will be very encouraging.
- 2- Family camp: We will be planning a two-day family camp to gather our Hispanic churches, an idea that came out of our mini retreat. We believe it will be encouraging for our church members, and healthy for our members to meet and spend time with other believers. Iron sharpens iron.
- 3- Pastors and wives mini retreat to encourage each other and plan for 2020. Please consider supporting multiethnic ministries in our district. If I can be of any help, please don't hesitate to contact me. I will talk on the phone, come to your church, or have breakfast with you. Let's reach out to those who God brings to us with the gospel of Jesus Christ and see lives transformed by his mighty power.

We are very happy to see what the Lord is doing in Camino de Vida. We meet every Sunday at 1:00 pm and every Wednesday at 6:30 pm for prayer meeting and Bible study. Only a few months ago we started celebrating communion every first Sunday of the month; Our church plant has been growing and little by little we are seeing more people getting involved in the work of the Lord.

My brother David Santos and his family moved to Lexington in August of 2017. We are blessed to have him as a part of our ministry. David and his family have been very involved since they moved to Lexington. He is leading Camino de Vida's praise and worship team and children's choir. David also has a Bible Study every Wednesday night for the adults in Camino de Vida and his wife Esmelda recently began a bible study for teenage girls.

David and his family go to Broken Bow twice a week to meet with people and are having bible studies every Saturday at 6:00 pm at the Broken Bow Evangelical Free Church. David reports that we have been able to see God's hand working. It has been possible to make contact and reach several people through visitation. At the first Bible study, only one person arrived, but by the grace of God, in the last one we had 9 adults (believers and non-believers) besides David, Esmelda and several children.

During the month of November, we celebrated that seven-people wanted to be baptized as a testimony of their faith in Jesus. It was a time of joy and fellowship with almost 140 people in attendance.

I also would like to thank our supporting churches for your continuous support through the years. Your generosity helps us tremendously in our efforts to reach out to the Hispanic community of Lexington, NE.

We began the year with about 15-20 people, we have grown slowly but growing. Attendance has gone up to even 40 people and we have also grown in knowledge. We have good leaders that if needed, they could continue leading the church. We have a small youth group now and hope and pray to see them as our next pastors.

Financially, at the beginning of 2018 we went through a very difficult time, but we are doing better now, a little more stable.

Four months ago, we were able to buy a small building, that seats 130 people, four small classrooms, a kitchen and a fellowship room, the land is 1 1/3 acre where if needed we could build onto the building, for now it's a big space for our youth to play. The property cost us \$50,000 and we only owe \$10,000 dollars. :) We are thankful to God for it. Please continue praying for us. Mission Catalyst

Why do our churches exist? This is the most fundamental question that we can ask. To answer this well clarifies much about what we emphasize and practice in our individual lives and as a church family. Jesus reminds us that He came with a purpose that He passed on to us. It is so that peoples to the very ends of the earth can come into a dynamic living relationship with the One True Glorious God through Christ our Savior. The purpose of the MWD Missions Catalyst is to mobilize and encourage individual churches and groups of churches in the Midwest District to make disciples of Jesus Christ through greater engagement in dynamic Acts 1:8 Missions Ministry.

In this first year I have been seeking to lay foundations for this ministry that will bear greater fruit in the next years. This means 3 primary focuses: 1) Connecting with the pastors and laymen leading our missions efforts; 2) Seeking connections with ministry leaders that can open up opportunity for us to bear fruit within each section of the world; and 3) build a Partnership Team to pray and financially support this ministry consistently over the next years. I sense significant progress in each of these areas.

I have been very grateful to preach on Missions at several churches around the District, have visited with Missions Committees, planned with Mission Teams, met with Pastors, visited Pastoral Clusters and made contacts with Missionary leaders from several different ministries around the world. These will continue to be what I give my time to as I attempt to be in all churches. Meeting people committed to making disciples from near to far is a great joy. Being consistently connected with 100+ sites is daunting. I pray that the Lord will lead me where He wants me to be the most helpful.

I am seeking to get connected with ministries to Unreached People Groups (UPGs). In October I was able to travel to Israel and then to Rwanda. In Rwanda I was able to be with 65 leaders from 7 countries who are practitioners of Disciple Making Movement (DMM) methodologies in planting churches. The movement I observed has planted thousands of churches, seen hundreds of thousands come to Christ, and multiplied some 180,000 disciple makers. From this trip I was connected with Aila Tasse who came to Nebraska just last week to share the story and train us in fruitful DMM methodology.

Beyond Africa I also am building connections with ministries in India subcontinent and other parts of Asia, with Latin America, and with Europe. I also am seeking to learn who the refugees and immigrants are among us. My hope is to match our churches who are already doing ministry in these areas with each other and with those who can bring them wise help. One of the items on my list of goals is to discover where God has all the churches working in Missions.

Any way that I could be of assistance to you? Please let me know. If you or your church would like to join my team, please let me know. I am still needing support. Thank you for the prayers and opportunity to serve Christ. It is a pleasure to serve the Lord with you.

Midwest District Foundation, Inc.

The Foundation of the Midwest District of the EFCA exists primarily to help churches within the district with funding for building projects. The Foundation also facilitates approving of several scholarships for pastors, and other individuals within the Midwest District of EFCA.

Presently, the Foundation has three loans out to churches in the MWD. We also have a loan out to an individual that was used for tuition. This year, we also processed and approved an application for an addition to an existing loan to a church for parking lot and roofing repair.

The Summary of Services below lists more specifically all the ways that the Foundation serves churches and individuals within the MWD EFCA.

Loans to Churches for First Time Building Projects:

Loans up to \$150,000 to churches for their first construction or ownership of church facilities. The loan can be for purchase of land, construction loan (provided land is paid), or purchase of church facility. Loans are for 5 years based on 20 year amortization with interest at 1.5% above current yield for five year US Treasuries. (Less than bank rates.)

Building Loans for Other Than First Time Building Projects:

Loans up to \$150,000 to existing churches for building projects, purchase of land, or purchase of facilities. Loans are for 5 years based on a 10 year amortization with interest the same as above.

Equipment Loans:

Unsecured loans up to \$10,000 may be granted for the purchase of equipment or other tangible needs. Loan terms are up to 3 years with interest the same as above.

Grants to Churches:

Grants may be given for Support Team Program, Pastoral Support Program, candidate expense, pastoral moving expense, Midwest District conference costs, Midwest District retreat costs or special needs as approved by the Board.

Grants to Pastors:

Grants may be given to pastors from the Emergency Relief Fund for such things as medical expenses not covered by insurance, inability to meet mortgage, insurance, or basic needs of his family for reasons beyond his control, and emergency counseling.

Grants to Midwest District:

Grants may be given for special projects approved in the budget or requested from the Midwest District Board. Grants may not be used for operational or general budget items.

Centennial Scholarship:

The scholarship fund makes up to \$1000 gifts to individuals who are pursuing theological education at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in anticipation of vocational Christian service who are or have been active members in an Evangelical Free Church in the Midwest District.

Stranberg Scholarship:

Provides funds to Trinity Evangelical Divinity School (TEDS) graduating students to help eliminate school debts accumulated during seminary training. Applicants must have held active membership in an Evangelical Free Church within the Midwest District prior to enrolling at TEDS and be willing to pastor an Evangelical Free Church.

Educational Loans for Students attending Trinity Evangelical Divinity School:

Loans up to \$5,000 to TEDS students to fund their education. 20% of the loan is forgiven for each year a graduate serves in a Midwest District Church ministry after graduation. For students not graduating, graduates not serving in the Midwest District or not serving in the EFCA, amortization of the loans are for 8 years.

Christian Homes

The goal is to have Christian Homes continue to be financially viable and serve the surrounding communities “neighbors caring for neighbors.”

In 2018 Christian Homes hosted and sponsored a community wide disaster drill in the event that a tornado would hit Holdrege, a food drive for the local pantry, clothing drive, and helped with food boxes at Thanksgiving and Christmas time. This was excellent team building and a way for the home to give back to the community. In addition, Christian Homes partnered with a local bank; this partnership led to every resident receiving a Christmas gift at the annual Resident/family Christmas Party. Joy was in the air as each resident opened their gift from “Santa”.

In the state of Nebraska where so many long-term care facilities are closing; Christian Homes is blessed by the Lord with residents to care for, staff to care for them, community support, and a strong leadership team. This is a winning combination for continued prosperity in 2019!
